

Transocean Announces Pricing of U.S. \$750 Million of Secured Notes Due 2024

STEINHAUSEN, Switzerland, June 27, 2018 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- Transocean Ltd. (NYSE:RIG) announced today that Transocean Guardian Limited ("Transocean Guardian"), a wholly owned indirect subsidiary of Transocean, has priced an offering of senior secured notes. Transocean Guardian will issue U.S. \$750 million in aggregate principal amount of senior secured notes due 2024 (the "Notes") to eligible purchasers pursuant to Rule 144A/Regulation S.

The Notes will be guaranteed by Transocean Ltd., Transocean Inc. and wholly owned indirect subsidiaries that own the *Songa Enabler* and *Songa Encourage*, and will be secured by a lien on the *Songa Enabler* and *Songa Encourage* and certain other assets related to the rigs.

The Notes will bear interest at the rate of 5.875% per annum and will be callable after July 15, 2021. The offering is expected to close on or about July 13, 2018, subject to customary closing conditions. Transocean Guardian expects to receive aggregate net proceeds of approximately \$732.5 million from the offering, after deducting the initial purchasers' discount and estimated offering costs.

The net proceeds from the Notes, together with cash on hand, will be used to refinance existing debt secured by the Songa Encourage and Songa Enabler.

The Notes have not been and will not be registered under the U.S. Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the "Securities Act"), or any state securities laws and may not be offered or sold in the United States except pursuant to an exemption from, or in a transaction not subject to, the registration requirements of the Securities Act and applicable state securities laws. The Notes to be offered may not be publicly offered, sold or advertised, directly or indirectly, in Switzerland. This press release shall not constitute an offer to sell or a solicitation of an offer to buy any of the Notes in the United States, shall not constitute an offer, solicitation or sale of any securities in any jurisdiction where such offering or sale would be unlawful and does not constitute an offering prospectus within the meaning of article 652a or article 1156 of the Swiss Code of Obligations. The company specializes in technically demanding sectors of the global offshore drilling business with a particular focus on deepwater and harsh environment drilling services, and believes that it operates one of the most versatile offshore drilling fleets in the world.

Transocean owns or has partial ownership interests in, and operates a fleet of 43 mobile offshore drilling units consisting of 24 ultra-deepwater floaters, 12 harsh environment floaters, two deepwater floaters and five midwater floaters. In addition, Transocean is constructing two ultra-deepwater drillships; and one harsh environment semisubmersible that the company has a one-third interest. The company also operates one high-specification jackup that was under a drilling contract when the rig was sold, and the company will continue to operate the jackup until completion or novation of the drilling contract.
